

Plan to install hundreds more cameras on fishing boats welcomed

The government is poised to spend millions of dollars on hundreds more cameras for the country's fishing boat fleet.



Fisheries Minister Stuart Nash said the government is funding a detailed business case and looking at the approval of new regulations.

Public consultation will be sought on the proposal which would see the rollout of 345 more cameras.

Cameras would cover all inshore areas where fishing poses significant risks to protected species.

If Cabinet signs off on the proposal, the rollout could begin in late 2021, costing an

estimated \$40 million to \$60 million over four years.

Now, let's look at this, how long have these Politicians been pissing around with this??? New Zealand First Blockaded this for the last two & half years,(probably longer?) the biggest Commercial fishing company, Sanford didn't want Cameras on their boats, so paid NZ First large amounts of money to stop Labour from installing the long awaited Cameras.

"I'm afraid not," explained Winston. "That's what we would call great loss."



The room went silent. No other Pupil volunteered.

"Fantastic!" exclaimed Winston , "That's right. And can you tell me why that would be a tragedy?"







Kia Ora Mark,

Thanks for sending the Link to [“The Price Of Fish”](#), first time I’ve been able to view it and I’m very impressed. Mike Bhana has done a wonderful job to first show the abundance of our fishery back in the 1920’s, how the fishing industry developed as technology enabled them to catch more and more. In our great grandfathers time they fished out of clinker built row boats, in my grandfathers day they built small 30 ft launches with 5/ 8 hp engines, (like the one hundred year old launch in my yard that my grandfather built in 1914.) In my dad’s day they were building 50 footers and harvesting all the inshore reefs, holes and pinnacles as well as discovering the off shore grounds like the Chatham rise.

They were the Glory days, Picton and the Sounds developed around the harvesting of natural resources, our tipuna Felled all the giant podocarps and burnt what they couldn’t sell and cleared the land for farming, in my dad’s time they were growing meat and wool, harvesting whales and selling fish.

In the sounds there would have been 50 fishing boats, as young people we had plenty of choices for employment, Seasonal work, they would work at the whaling station during the winter, then they’d go shearing, then work at the freezing works over summer, then scrub cutting then back to fishing and or the whaling season would be ready to start again, they were earning good money all year round.

Half the towns folk were employed directly or indirectly in the whaling/ fishing industry, Fishermen, women working in the fish processing plants, my dad was a boat builder.

The wooden boat building industry was flourishing because every 15/20 yrs the fishermen would have a new boat built, bigger faster, could fish off shore in rougher conditions and stay out longer, all the tradesmen, electricians, marine engineers, (like myself,) hydraulic engineers, painters, mechanics, riggers net builders, etc.....

Then the QMS came in and the right to the fish was GIVEN to (some,) in perpetuity, it could be leased

sold & traded, I liked the way the feller in the video referred to it as Feudalism, That’s exactly what it is, and it was unfair in many respects, Maori in particular were disadvantaged because to qualify for quota you had to have a documented catch history and fished full time, this meant that all the men who were seasonal workers missed out, the lucky ones became over night millionaires and were given exclusive rights to something that belonged to all New Zealanders.

Like the doco said that quota has all ended up under the control of a handful of companies, using huge factory trawlers, processing is done aboard, (local processing plants have all closed) the wooden boat building yards have all closed, the heavy tackle used by the big boats have devastated all the inshore fishing grounds by smashing the habitat. NZ was the last country on earth to be discovered by man and it was rich in natural resources, which our tipuna were quick to capitalise on, however capitalism is all about harvesting and processing resources, within 5 generations the resources had been exhausted, the seals & whales have all been caught, the podocarps have all been felled, the Sounds farms had been exhausted by over exploitation and were exhausted of nutrients and uneconomic, this resulted in the freezing works closing along with the fish processing plants, the boat building yards have closed along with all the associated trades, the wooden fishing boats have one by one been converted into pleasure boats. The glory days are gone! It happened for 2 reasons, one is the unsustainable over exploitation of natural resources, with all focus on profits and none on the future and what I call capitalist, corporate/ political Corruption.

I worked in the fishing industry on the big trawlers and to my shame, we caught the last of the Orange Roughy on the big pinnacles on the Chatham rise, then I wanted a job closer to home so signed onto a Hoki boat working out of Wellington, the waste, the dumping of tons and tons of fish, is what sickened me,...it wasn’t just the fishing practices; it was also because of the mercenary attitude of the

commercial fishermen. (now they call themselves Kaitiaki of the Seas !) I quit in disgust.
Mate the video is right, MPI have been hi jacked by industry and big business, their management of the aquaculture industry where they have quota'ed nearly every living creature is criminal.
Government agencies have been hi jacked by corporate interests under the guise of Corporatisation, Privatisation and Globalization ex CEO's, like John Key, now 1% of the population control 90% of the worlds wealth.
So now a resource that was owned by us all is now controlled by 10 companies !
you watch the next leader of the National party will be it ex CEO of Air NZ, the guy Muller was Ex Fonterra !

I just hope that NZ First fails to reach the 5% threshold, they are a corrupt bunch.

I have spent 30 years battling corruption , we managed to slow it down but have never been able to defeat it, because they just keep reinventing themselves.

I wrote to a mate in the UK the other day and said that I hoped that there would be valuable lessons to be learnt from this Covid disaster, he wrote back and said

“We are lambs surrounded by wolves, we need to be as cunning as a serpent & peaceful as doves !”

Mark, next time you are talking to your mate Scott at Legasea, please tell him that I've watched this video and am very proud of them. Successful campaigning depends on first educating the public about our history, get them angry about the injustice then try and get them to support and VOTE.





(CRA 2) and the Canterbury/Marlborough (CRA 5) rock lobster fisheries from 1 July 2020.

In the Hauraki Gulf/Bay of Plenty fishery, known as CRA 2, the recreational daily bag limit has reduced from 6 spiny rock lobsters per person to a new daily limit of 3.

For the Marlborough/Canterbury rock lobster fishery, known as CRA 5, the recreational accumulation limit has reduced to 3 daily bag limits (a total of 18 rock lobsters). Bag and tag conditions have also been introduced, requiring fishers to clearly store and label each day's catch. These rules already apply in the Kaikōura Marine Area, a sub-area of CRA 5.






